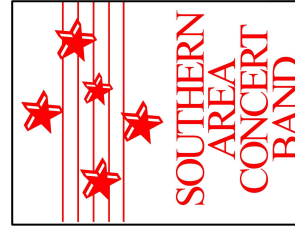

- **O Ye Como Va** — A Spanish favourite colloquially meaning "Hey, how's it going?", written by Cachao and covered by Tito Puente in 1963.
- **New York, New York** — Written by John Kander and Fred Ebb and performed in the 1977 film of the same name by Liza Minnelli.
- **Fever** — Written by Eddie Cooney and John Davenport in 1956 and performed today by Michele Forbes.
- **All Blues** — Classic Miles Davis from 1959.
- **The American Patrol** — Originally written by Frank Meacham in 1885, was later adapted by Glenn Miller in 1940.
- **Perhaps, Perhaps, Perhaps** — Originally written in Spanish by Cuban composer Osvaldo Farrés in 1947. Performed today by Michele Forbes.
- **Sway** — Originally Written in Spanish in 1953 by Mexican Composer Pablo Beltrán Ruiz. Performed today by Michele Forbes.

- **Fantasy on When Johnny Comes Marching Home** — Commissioned by the US Military Academy in 1998 and written by Robert Starer. Performed today on piccolo by Anne Richardson.
- **Celebration for Winds and Percussion** — Commissioned by South Woods Middle School, New York in 1999 and written by James Swearingen. Conducted today by Jenny Corcoran.
- **Poor Wandering One** — From Gilbert and Sullivan's *Pirates of Penzance* and performed today on clarinet by Alanna Richards.
- **Silver Screen** — In the style of the silent movie accompaniment, today's performance will accompany an edited version of Buster Keaton's *The General*.
- **Blue Moon** — Written in 1934 by Richard Rodgers with lyrics by Lorenz Hart. Performed today on trombone by Don Jordan.
- **Over the Rainbow** — Written in 1939 by Harold Arlen and EY Harburg for *The Wizard of Oz*. Performed today on tenor saxophone by Andrew Wright.
- **Bugler's Holiday** — Music written in 1954 by Leroy Anderson and featuring the band's trumpet section.
- **The Gladiator March** — Composed in 1886, this was John Philip Sousa's first march to enjoy wide commercial success.
